Q: Where does mold typically grow in homes?

A: Mold thrives in damp and humid areas. Common locations include bathrooms, basements, kitchens, and areas with water leaks.

Q: Can mold cause health problems?

A: Yes, exposure to mold can lead to respiratory issues, allergies, and skin irritation. Individuals with weakened immune systems may be more susceptible.

Q: Are there specific types of mold to be concerned about?

Q: Can I paint over mold to cover it up?

A: Specific paints are designed to encapsulate mold. However, it is essential to address the root cause and remove mold properly to prevent continual growth.

How do we test for mold?

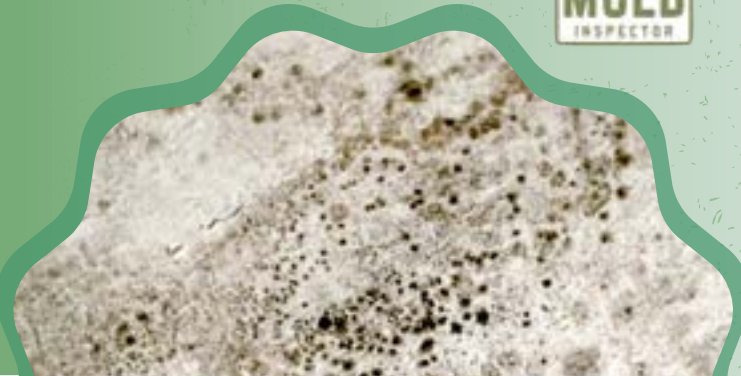

Mold Prevention Tips & Tricks

- ✓ **Complete routine checks** - Inspect your property for evidence of water damage and visible mold growth.
- ✓ **Control humidity levels** - Keep humidity levels as low as you can, typically between 30% and 50%, all day long.
- ✓ **Promptly fix leaks** - Fix any leaks in your home's roof, walls, or plumbing so mold does not have moisture to grow.
- ✓ **Thorough cleaning** - Regularly scrub bathroom areas. Be sure to dry surfaces completely after flooding.
- ✓ **Ensure ventilation** - Be sure your home has enough ventilation in showers, laundry rooms, and cooking areas.
- ✓ **Proactive thinking** - Avoid using carpet in rooms or areas like bathrooms or basements that may have a lot of moisture and are known to harbor mold.
